

## SPEAK OUT EVALUTAION EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Audience of 2,075 in 2013, including 1,050 from 12 regional towns, and 190 teachers

510 Students from regional and metropolitan areas took part in a written post-performance survey, which found that:

## **ENJOYMENT:**

85% enjoyed the performance 21% volunteered an intervention

## **RECOGNITION OF HOMOPHOBIA:**

53% of students had recognised homophobia in the past 33% of students had seen homophobia in the past but had not recognised it until they had seen Speak Out

## **RESPONDING TO HOMOPHOBIA:**

56% of students said there are more likely to respond and help if they see homophobia at school after seeing Speak Out (20% said "maybe", 15% said "Do not know" and 5% specifically stated that they were not more likely to respond and help).

73% were given useful techniques to respond to people who say "That's so gay" 74% were useful given techniques to support someone who is same sex attracted

95% of students were provided with at least one technique to stop homophobia
